

Fenntartható fejlesztési célok - Kezdeti lépések rendszerelméleti szemszögből

The SDGs offer a vision of a fairer, more prosperous, peaceful, sustainable and inclusive world. The SDGs cannot be achieved in isolation: reaching all the goals paves the way to ending hunger and poverty. Among the diverse political institutions engaged in implementation, a proper approach to SDG implementation must promote ownership at all levels and in all sectors. The implementation of the SDGs should be initiated and take place through participatory processes, adhering to the principle of subsidiarity. The SDGs need to be translated into national targets and then localized in their entirety, not just by pursuing “low-hanging fruits”. Science-policy cooperation needs to be institutionalized and held up throughout the 15 years of implementation. Selection of relevant targets and orchestration of their implementation according to their role and rank in the system needs to be done for levels of governance, from EU to regional, national and local. Work has to start with raising wide awareness and support for the new agenda. Ongoing capacity building at all levels of governance is needed during the whole duration of the program. General lessons drawn from recent transitions in CEE are worth collecting and sharing. Public participation and the continuous engagement of “catalysts” providing facilitator assistance to the process will be decisive.
